<u>Formative Assessments</u> include the objectives below and are 50% of the student's total grade. Students will be asked to perform specific scales and arpeggios from memory during class. Students will have one (1) chance to perform the scale and arpeggio. An "error" is defined as a wrong note, a severely out of tune note, or a disturbance of the time and/or rhythm. Each error is worth five (5) points and the errors will be tallied at the end of the performance and deducted from 100 for the scale grade. Scales not performed the correct number of octaves as per the mid-state range requirements will be handled at the director's discretion. Students will be allowed one (1) retake for any scale (before school, primetime, after school) and whichever grade is the highest will be the grade that will be assigned. All retakes must occur before the end of school on Wednesday, 5/10/17.
