Formative Assessments include the objectives below and are 50% of the student's total grade.

Students will be asked to perform specific scales & arpeggios from memory during class. Students will have one (1) chance to perform the scale & arpeggio. An "error" is defined as a wrong note, a severely out of tune note, a disturbance of the time and/or rhythm, or incorrect sticking. Each error is worth five (5) points and the errors will be tallied at the end of the performance and deducted from 100 for the scale grade. Students will be allowed one (1) retake for any scale (before school, C&I, after school) and whichever grade is the highest will be the grade that will be assigned. Regarding the etudes, 5 points will be deducted for each note/rhythmic error. Any retakes must occur before the end of school on Friday, May 10, 2019.

1. 2 Random Major Scales & Arpeggios #1
2. Blaze Perc. WU Routine: 9th/10th – C:S1 with a metronome at a minimum of 100 bpm.
11th/12th – C:S2 with a metronome at a minimum of 80 bpm.
3. Mallet Etude #1
4. 2 Random Rudiments #1
5. Blaze Perc. WU Routine: 9th/10th – D:S1 with a metronome at a minimum of 110 bpm.
11th/12th – D:S2 with a metronome at a minimum of 110 bpm.

Grading scale for Music Assessments: The grade you earn is the grade you receive. If a student chooses to retake a worksheet, ONE re-take is allowed. The higher score will be the grade.

Students are expected to come to class prepared. This means having your instrument and all necessary equipment for the rehearsal (reeds, mouthpiece, valve oil, mutes, sticks/mallets, pad/stand, etc.). Students are expected to be in their seat with music (folder, Foundations Book, warm-up exercises, concert music, etc.) and a pencil. Percussion students should be set up and have all materials ready for class at the 8:30 bell. Failure to do so will result in a deduction of 2 points per missing item or infraction. Students should be rehearsal ready and focused throughout the rehearsal. Any disruptions (talking or otherwise) will result in a deduction from the participation grade. This will be at the discretion of the directors.

10. Participation & Rehearsal Techniques
